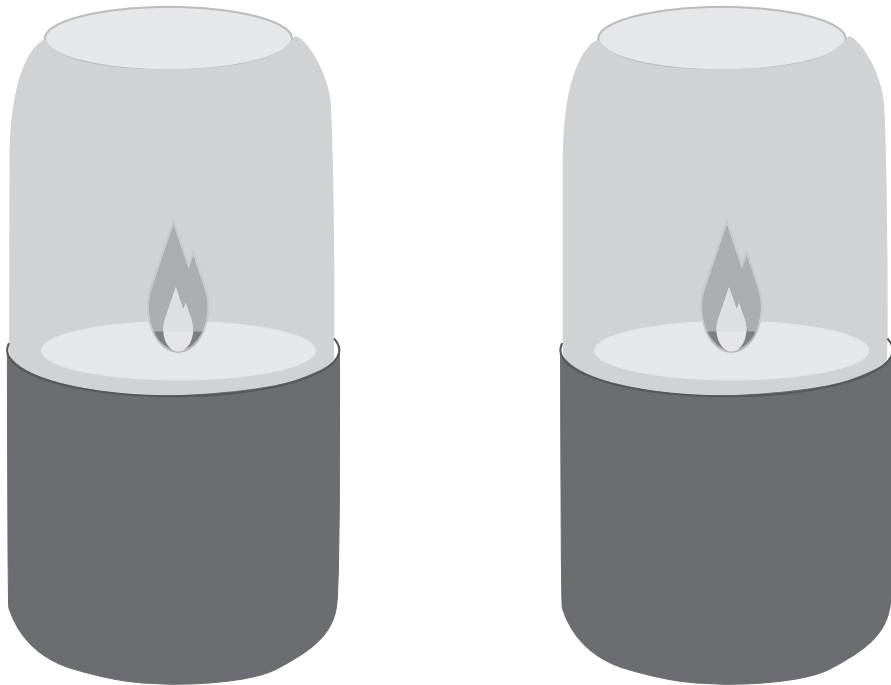
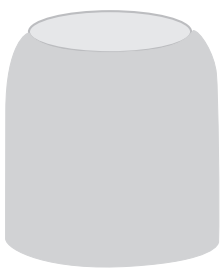

READ BEFORE USING

IMPORTANT SAFETY MEASURES

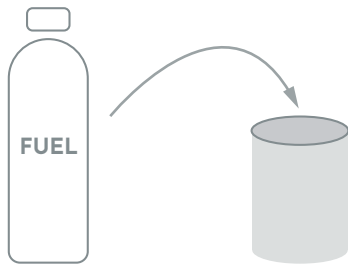
- **WARNING:** Only use Liquid Bio-Ethanol or 91% Isopropyl Alcohol to avoid a flash fire. Liquid Bio-Ethanol Fuel is highly recommended for use with this fire pit. 91% Isopropyl Alcohol (rubbing alcohol) is acceptable, however, this may cause odors/fumes, residue, and/or soot.
- Never leave a lit oil lamp unattended.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- Always use on a stable and level heat resistant surface.
- Keep all flammable materials such as curtains and other decor at least 4 feet away from the oil lamp.
- Use in a well ventilated area greater than 80 sq. feet.
- Remove all packing materials, cardboard, foam, plastic film etc. before use.
- As with all open flames, keep a fire extinguisher nearby.
- If you spill any of the fuel, be sure to clean immediately.
- Do not smoke while filling the fuel cup.
- Never add fuel while the oil lamp is lit or still hot. Wait at least 15 minutes before adding fuel to the fuel cup.
- Allow the fuel cup to fully burn out. If you need to extinguish the flame, use the snuffer. Do not attempt to blow it out or use water.
- Do not touch or move any part of the oil lamp while lit or still hot.
- The flame may burn low at first and may be blue and difficult to see. Allow 15 minutes for flame to achieve full size.
- If the flame fully extinguishes before 15 minutes has passed, use the snuffer to ensure it has been fully extinguished, wait until the cup has cooled, refill with fuel, and then re-ignite the wick.
- Store fuel containers far away from any heat source and out of reach from children or pets.
- Do not make modifications to the oil lamp.
- Not intended as a heat source.

MAINTENANCE & CARE

- Trim the wick after multiple uses once it becomes carbonized
- Clean the oil lamp regularly. Use a wet cloth to clean the surface of the oil lamp.
- Do not attempt to clean the wick. Only clean the glass hurricane, oil lamp base, and fuel cup.
- Do not put in a dishwasher.
- Never use any chemicals or cleaning solutions to clean the oil lamp Use only water.
- Never use steel wool or scrubbing sponges to clean the oil lamp. Use only soft lint free cloths.
- Leave snuffer over fuel cup when not in use. This helps preserve any remaining fuel from evaporating.

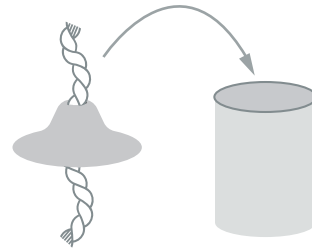
Step 1

Fill Fuel Cup (C) about 2/3 with fuel.



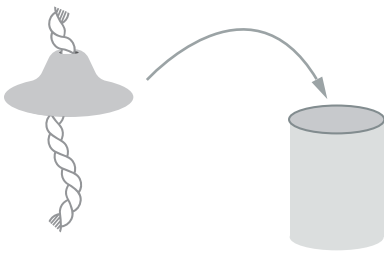
Step 2

Slide the Wick (F) about halfway through the Collar (E). Dip the top half of the Wick in fuel to moisten it.



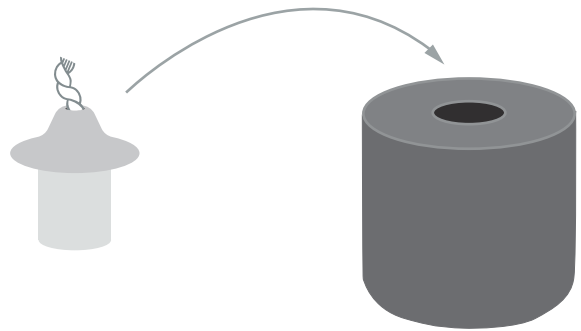
Step 3

Pull Wick back leaving 1/2" on top. Place Wick and Collar on Fuel Cup ensuring the bottom of Wick is inside Fuel Cup.



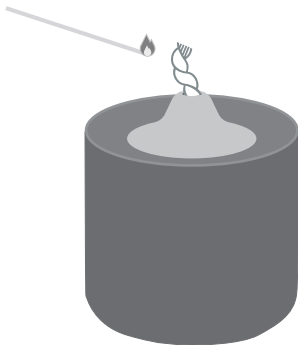
Step 4

Place assembled Fuel Cup in Fuel Cup Hole on top of the Oil Lamp Base (B).



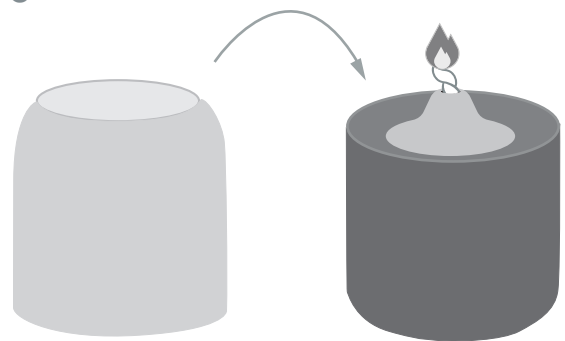
Step 5

Use extended reach lighter or long match (not included) to ignite the Wick.



Step 6

Place Glass Hurricane (A) on top of Oil Lamp Base (B) inside the perimeter's edge.



Step 7

To extinguish the flame, place the Snuffer (D) over the Fuel Cup and Wick until the flame has ceased. Repeat Steps 1 - 6 if you haven't used the Oil Lamp in over 7 days.
